Students in this course will engage with World Literature, according to Common Core curriculum standards, through their abilities to:

**Write** arguments to support claims in an analysis of substantive topics or texts, using valid reasoning, relevant evidence, and thorough analysis

**Write** informative/explanatory texts to examine and convey complex ideas, concepts, and information clearly and accurately through the effective selection, organization, and analysis of content

**Write** narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events using effective technique, well-chosen details, and well-structured event sequences

Conduct **research** projects with a self-generated question,

#### **Teacher Expectations**


- Maintain a respectful, academic environment through clear explanations, extra help as necessary, and management of distracting or disrespectful situations.

# Homework, Late Work, Absent Work and Academic Honesty

- •Homework must be headed with MLA style and turned in properly in Google Classroom. Links on comments do not count as a submission. Marking something done when a file was expected does not count.
- •All assignments are due in Google Classroom before the specified due date and will be not count if it is labeled LATE.
- •Do not wait until the last hour to submit homework. This may cause some problems in submitting an assignment. Blaming Google Classroom and saying "It didn't want to work" is not an excuse. Do not wait 10 minutes until the due date to turn it in. PLAN AHEAD, PLAN ACCORDINGLY.
- PMA's policy states that NO LATE WORK IS ACCEPTED. You cannot make up any late work and get any credit for it; especially weeks after it was already due. There is a deadline and you must stick to it; this is non negotiable.
